Self-isolation

The self-isolation period has been extended to 10 days for those in the community who have COVID-19 symptoms or a positive test result

Social distancing

Latest government guidance on social distancing advises the following:

- Stay at home as much as possible
- Work from home if you can
- Limit contact with other people
- Keep your distance if you go out (2 metres apart where possible)
- Wash your hands regularly

Shielding

On 1 August (Saturday) the government paused shielding. This means those who have been shielding will no longer have to, although they are still being advised to stay at home as much as possible.

Free food parcels, medical deliveries and care from the National Shielding Service will stop although volunteers will still be available to assist with deliveries of food and prescriptions and those registered will still be eligible for priority supermarket delivery slots.

Face coverings

The wearing of face coverings is now mandatory on all forms of public transport as well as in <u>shops and supermarkets in England</u>. Face coverings should also be worn in enclosed public spaces where maintaining two-metre social distancing isn't possible. This is most relevant for short periods indoors

and in crowded areas. From the 8th August the list of places where members of the public have to wear a face covering has been expanded.

The public have been advised to wear face coverings when attending healthcare settings such as GP surgeries and hospitals either as a visitor or outpatient.

A face covering is a covering of any type, which covers your nose and mouth. For guidance on how to wear and make a cloth face covering please <u>click here</u>. A cloth face covering should cover your mouth and nose while allowing you to breathe comfortably. It can be as simple as a scarf or bandana that ties behind the head.

Updates from system SCC cells

PRIMARY CARE

Update from Royal Papworth Hospital: sleep and cardiology services Royal Papworth Hospital has switched on GP referrals in its sleep and cardiology services as of 15th August 2020. There are three RAS in place within eRS:-

- sleep
- specialised cardiology
- arrhythmia & pacing devices cardiology

All three services have been published and should now be visible. All RAS are available for advice and referral. As a tertiary hospital, no other services are open for GP referrals. The RAS process will be kept under review along with response rates and timeframes.

ERS referrals to Royal Papworth Hospital

Further to the communication above, a technical issue relating to E-RS and the Royal Papworth Hospital (RPH) has been identified and is due to an incorrect postcode for the ODS location for Papworth (ODS has it as CB2 0AT, when it should be CB2 0AY). E-RS relies on the location's postcode to calculate and display services in distance from the patient's own address.

Cambridge and Peterborough CCG have emailed the ODS team to resolve this, but in the meantime there is a crude workaround until the postcode is corrected. That is to advise your GPs that they can still locate the Papworth services if they remove the postcode and add Royal Papworth in the e-RS search screen – as shown below.

A further communication will be circulated as soon as the postcode issue is resolved. Enter one or more of the following fields. Free webinar: at the heart of diabetes, by Kevin Fernando – coproduced by Primary Care Cardiovascular Society, Tuesday, 25th August at 7pm

Cardiovascular disease is the leading cause of death in people living with type 2 diabetes.

Since concerns were highlighted with rosiglitazone, it was made mandatory for all new diabetes drugs to prove their cardiovascular safety. Somewhat unexpectedly, not only was cardiovascular safety established with certain newer diabetes drugs but also cardiovascular superiority compared to placebo i.e. significant reductions in major adverse cardiovascular events.

This webinar will summarise key take-home messages from all the published diabetes cardiovascular outcome studies to date, how these studies have changed guidelines and what the implications are for primary care.

Northamptonshire's Public Health team to start local Contact Tracing this week (press release)

Northamptonshire County Council's Public Health team are set to be amongst the first areas in the country to take on local contact tracing responsibilities when it launches today (Wednesday 19th August).

Luton, Leicester and Blackburn are already successfully carrying out local contact tracing measures and Northamptonshire proactively sought to take on this responsibility in response to a recent increase in cases to ensure as many COVID-19 cases are followed up as possible.
